October Vesty Highlights

At the October Vestry meeting, the Vestry:

- Wished Vestry member Elizabeth Porter a Happy Birthday!
- Endorsed having an Advent program in 2020.
- Heard that Bishop Love of Albany has lost in an ecclesiastical trial, and that Bishop Sumner (et al) has written in support of Bishop Love.
- Heard that Diocesan Convention will be via Zoom on November 7th.
- Heard that the Safety Team has met a couple times, including with the Greenville Police Department, and expects to be fully operational by the end of the year.
- Reviewed that our church service opening (or closing) is tied to GISD. If GISD is open on Friday, we will be open on that Sunday. An outdoor service is being considered, should the church building be closed.
- Approved new signatories for our accounts at Alliance Bank.
- Heard that St. Joseph's Guild has not been meeting, however the work of maintaining the church plant continues, especially the additional cleaning.
- Heard that \$24,000 has been donated to the roof fund.
- Heard that the School and Parish have delivered cards and water to the local firemen, and will do the same for the EMT's and police.
- Heard that the Diocesan online Alpha Course is ongoing.
- Heard that the Nominating Committee is composed of the outgoing Vestry, and as these particular persons were appointed, rather than elected, they are not prohibited for running for election in 2021.
- Approved a Background Check Policy and Scope. This includes the requirement for all Vestry members, employees, and youth workers to undergo a background check.
