On November 7, we had our Diocesan Convention via Zoom. Unlike our Presidential election, the Diocesan Convention had no contention or difficulty in voting. In my opinion, the most noteworthy issues had to do with the budget. For 2021, the Diocesan assessment will be reduced by 1%, and we will not have to pay an assessment in January 2021.
