The second great branch of Christian righteousness is closely and inseparably connected with the first branch: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." With regard to others, your most impassioned desires are to prevent or remove every evil from them and seek for them every possible good. Your neighbors include more than the virtuous, the friendly or those who love you. Your neighbors are also those who do not accept your kindness but rather return it back to you. Every child of Adam is our neighbor—every human being, every soul that God has made. We do not exclude those you have never seen in the flesh or those you do not know by face or name. You are not to exclude those you know to be evil and unthankful or those that continue hatefully to use and persecute you. You will love them as you love yourself. You must love them with a constant desire for their complete happiness and the same tireless care to defend them from whatever might grieve or hurt their souls or bodies.

"All Christians who have been baptized with water in the Name of the Holy Trinity and are permitted to receive Holy Communion in their own church, are welcome to do so here, regardless of denomination. Communion is received in the following way: a priest places the Bread in the palm of your hand, which you then consume; to receive the Wine, hold the base of the chalice, guide it to your lips. If for medical or other reasons you wish only to receive only bread or wine, the Church has always taught that a person still receives all the benefits of Holy Communion by receiving one consecrated element. The practice of dipping the Bread into the Wine is not permitted. If you do not wish to receive communion but would like to receive a blessing, please come forward and simply cross your arms over your chest. "
