From the words of St. Paul it is evident that Holy Communion is a standard, stated means of receiving the grace of God. In the preceding chapter, the apostle wrote, "The cup of blessing that we bless, is it not a sharing in the blood of Christ? The bread that we break, is it not a sharing in the body of Christ?" Is not eating of this bread and the drinking of this cup the outward, visible means through which God conveys grace to our souls? Is it not all of the spiritual grace, righteousness, peace, and joy in the Holy Spirit that were purchased by the body of Christ once broken, and the blood of Christ once shed for us? Therefore, let everyone who truly desires the grace of God eat of that bread and drink of that cup.

8:00 — Holy Eucharist Rite I

The Blessing & Dismissal BCP 339

"All Christians who have been baptized with water in the Name of the Holy Trinity and are permitted to receive Holy Communion in their own church, are welcome to do so here,

regardless of denomination. Communion is received in the following way: a priest places the Bread in the palm of your hand, which you then consume; to receive the Wine, hold the base of the chalice, guide it to your lips. If for medical or other reasons you wish only to receive only bread or wine, the Church has always taught that a person still receives all the benefits of Holy Communion by receiving one consecrated element. The practice of dipping the Bread into the Wine is not permitted. If you do not wish to receive communion but would like to receive a blessing, please come forward

and simply cross your arms over your chest. "
