Inspection stickers used to have printed on the back, "Drive carefully: the life you save may be your own." That is the wisdom of men in a nutshell. In terms of men's wisdom, he was a perfect fool, and anybody who thinks he can follow him without making something like the same kind of fool of himself is laboring not under a cross but a delusion.

### *Vestry Highlights*

At the June Vestry meeting, the Vestry:

- Discussed “what changes would make St. Paul’s into more of Jesus’ church?”
- Heard that the Fort Worth Diocese that left the Episcopal Church won the lawsuit to retain their property.
- Thanked Bill Rolston and Elizabeth Porter for helping out with office duties while Angela is on maternity leave.
- Heard that the Policy Committee will re-review the draft of “St. Paul’s Disaster Response Plan.”
- Heard that Sunday in-person service has resumed at 10:30. Live streaming will continue indefinitely. The attendance has been under capacity, and Clardy Hall is available should we reach capacity.
- Heard that the 8:00 and Wednesday in-person services will resume when attendance and service support is expected to reach critical mass (i.e. 10 persons). The Wednesday Noonday service may shift to 10:30 am to be closer to the Children’s Chapel.
- Heard that Altar flower prices have increased.
- Heard that the Rector will take a six-day spiritual retreat at All Saints Camp & Conference Center beginning of August.
- Was asked for questions should be included in a Parish Survey.
- Heard that St. Joseph’s Guild is on hiatus due to coronavirus concerns.
- Heard that bids are being solicited for the roof on Clardy Hall and the school.
- Heard that the fire lanes have been repainted, per the Fire Marshal's report.
- Heard that the school will be discussing the repair/replacement of the school sign.
- Heard that the Stewardship Committee will be looking at planned giving in the future.
- Approved: “The St. Paul’s Day Celebration will occur on June 28th after the 10:30 service. Joe Bleier will provide BBQed lamb, and parishioners will be invited to provide other food. The celebration will be in Clardy Hall and breezeway as a way to invite people back to church. Efforts will be taken to insure proper physical distancing and cleaning.”
